

Salzburg, literally meaning 'salt castle', holds a massive historical legacy and is a UNESCO world heritage site. The fourth-largest city was re-established as the bispherical city on the ruins of the old Roman town of Iuvavum. Apart from its architectural splendor, it is also known for mining and trading salt and at present inhabits more than 150,000 people. The city is famous for the trail of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart or 'The Sound of Music' and the Salzburg University is one of the oldest institutes of higher education. The baroque city is ideal for evening functions and events. Salzburg's enchanting lanes, charming connecting alleyways and fascinating museums are ideal for events.

Salzburg holds more than 4,000 cultural events every year and its galleries, museums and exhibitions provide fascinating insights attracting both leisure and business travellers. Salzburg is considered as the best investment location in Europe with its highly available transport carriers, efficient rail network and an attractive economic structure. Hohensalzburg Fortress : Millions are drawn to the '**City of Mozart**' every year to view the best preserved castle in Europe on the rooftops of the Baroque historical district the Hohensalzburg Fortress rests on the Festungsberg. It was built by the archbishop Gebhard in 1077 and over the years had undergone changes; in 1500 it was reframed by the archbishop Leonhard von Keutschach.

Ice cave in Werfen: Extending more than 42 km into the mountain, it is the world's biggest cave which is also known as Werfen's '**World of Ice Giants**'. This is a protected natural monument and its first section, which is around a kilometre in length, features imposing ice formations.

Thailand generated 54 billion baht in the second quarter of fiscal 2019 from 8 million MICE travellers


Thailand witnessed more than 8 million MICE travellers generating 54 billion baht in the second quarter of fiscal 2019 as per the Thailand Convention and Exhibition Bureau. The number of MICE tourists rose by 2.9 per cent and the revenues increased by 6.3 percent year-on-year. In Thailand, the fiscal year is October to September. Q2 period starts from January and ends in March 2019.

TCEB president Chiruit Isarangkun Na Ayuthaya said that international MICE travellers during the period stood at 353,256 (+11 per cent), earning 26.7 billion baht in income, (+7 per cent). The key category was corporate meetings. The top five in international Mice arrivals in the quarter were China, India, Japan, Hong Kong and Indonesia. The domestic MICE travellers represented some 7.75 million travellers in the period – a rise of 18 per cent. It generated 28 billion baht which was a increase of 180 per cent. Exhibitions and incentives were the key categories. The agency predicts a total of 35.9 million MICE travellers this year, with spending of 221.5 billion baht, up from 34.2 million travellers and 213 billion baht in the last fiscal year (October 2017-September 2018).

offering upscale tourism. Perfect Day at CocoCay has a record-setting water slide and a massive wave pool to five new complimentary dining venues and quiet sandy beaches. Michael Bayley, Royal Caribbean International's president and CEO said in a statement, they are so proud to bring their 50-year legacy of innovation ashore to transform an incredible island that now completely revolutionizes private destinations in the vacation industry. CocoCay is the first in a planned collection of Royal Caribbean Perfect Day islands. Several other cruise lines have private islands in the Bahamas, among them Disney Cruise Line's Castaway Cay and Holland America's Half Moon Cay.



White Night Ballarat 2019 expects to draw millions to local economy

Ballarat will this year host the famous night of lights for a third year, before it moves to Bendigo and then Geelong over the next two years. Minister for Tourism, Sport and Major Events Martin Pakula was joined by Member for Wendouree Juliana Addison and Member for Buninyong Michaela Settle to announce that White Night will return to this historic goldrush city on Saturday, 21 September 2019, from 7pm to 2am. Last year's White Night Ballarat drew huge crowds of more than 60,000 people. This included more than 15,000 from out of town, generating \$5 million to the local visitor economy.

Under the artistic direction of David Atkins OAM, White Night Ballarat invites visitors and locals to make their journey around Ballarat's iconic buildings and cultural institutions, streets and parks, in celebration of reclaiming and reimagining the city through projection, installations, performance and music. White Night Ballarat will take the lead as Victoria's regional White Night this year, with Melbourne set to host White Night Reimagined across three nights of large-scale live performance, installations and projections at Carlton Gardens, Treasury Gardens and Birrarung Marr. White Night will also continue in Ballarat, Bendigo and Geelong to share the hosting role over the next three years. Ballarat will host in 2019, Bendigo in 2020 and Geelong in 2021, continuing the success in Victoria's regional centres in celebrating the creativity and beauty of each regional city.

Sri Lanka launching mega tourism campaign in Thailand

The Sri Lanka Tourism Ministry is planning to launch a mega promotional campaign in Thailand to attract tourists from short-haul markets after seeing a sharp decline in arrivals following the Easter Sunday attacks that claimed over 300 lives, which created mayhem in travel and tourism industry. It is according to the Tourism Ministry of Sri Lanka, this tourism campaign will kick off in Thailand with the participation of 20 Sri Lanka destination management companies promoting the island country's scenic locations and food at two separate travel events.





Plitvice Lakes National Park


Revel In The Song Of Lakes

Located in the mountainous karst area of central Croatia, at the border of Bosnia and Herzegovina, Plitvice Lakes National Park is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This oldest and largest national park in Croatia draws about 1 million visitors annually. The park lies at the cusp of two mountain ranges - Mala Kapela and Lička Plješivica.

Visitors come to the Plitvice Lakes National Park for its cascading lakes. The lake system comprises of 16 named and several other smaller lakes that flow into one another. These interconnected lakes are separated by natural dams of travertine deposited by the action of moss, algae and others. The process of the tufa, travertine and barriers resulted in the creation of the lakes—which came into being about 12,000 to 15,000 years back.

Open throughout the year, the Plitvice Lakes National Park offers visitors seven routes to tour the lake; and four hiking trails. The lakes swirl into the beautiful waterfall Sastavci and end in Korana River under the base of the falls. The park is punctuated by many more waterfalls.

The less permeable dolomite rock and the karstified, highly permeable Jurassic and Cretaceous layers of limestone rock have resulted in the way Plitvice Lakes National Park has been carved out by nature.




Lake Tour

The lake tour includes four routes each from Entrance 1 and 2. They differ in duration, trail length and places of visit. Depending on the routes, visitors can experience the myriad contours of the lake region – deep and dark blue Upper lakes and Lower lakes; electric-boat ride across Lake 'Kozjak' - the largest of the Plitvice lakes; a train ride piercing through the roaring beauty of the landscape; a walk along the eastern side of the canyon; various waterfalls including 'Sastavci', deep and sharp cliffs and more.

The sound of the flow of water; the breath of the trees around; various hues donned by the park; and the immensity of mountain folds; all complement the tranquil and serene ambience of the Plitvice Lakes National Park.

Activities Around The Plitvice Lakes National Park





Due to its mountainous location, Plitvice Lakes National Park offers skiing, snowboarding and sleighing as winter tourism activities. In the winter the multi-coloured park dons sheets of white.

Located next to the DC429 state road, in the village Mukinje, the ski resort is 2.5 km away from Entrance 2 and 5 km from Entrance 1. It has a gentle slope gradient with an average slope gradient of 15 per cent and is ideal for beginners and recreational skiers. The ski resort offers rentals for equipment related to skiing and snowboarding including snow saucers, sleighs, and toboggan sleds. The ski trails are around 400 m long. It has one ski lift with a capacity of 400 skiers per hour. Guests can enjoy night skiing under floodlights on Fridays and Saturdays.

Plitvice Lakes National Park has two hiking trails of 2.5 hrs and 1.5 hrs each. These take the visitors around any of the three peaks on the ridge. These peaks are Oštří Medveđak (889 m), Tupi Medveđak (868 m) and Turčić (801 m). The 21-km long 'Čorkova Bay' Trail and 9-km long 'Plitvica' Trail passes through Labudovac to hip dock at Kozjačka draga through various points. Pythagoras has rightly said, "Leave the road take the trails".

Cycling is permitted exclusively on the state roads D429, D42 and D52 and not in the Plitvice Lakes National Park. The cycling activities are possible in the southern edge parts of the park (cycling trails in the municipality Plitvička Jezera) and on the northern side (cycling trails within the municipality Rakovica). As one hike, walks, rides or cycles through the picturesque Plitvice Lakes National Park, the scene changes to flash waterfalls, cliffs, fauna, bushes, river and more in one's memory, creating an enthralling experience.

Sojourn At The Park



To experience the park in its entirety, visitors should spend at least 2 – 3 days. There are 3 hotels located in the National Park: Hotel Jezero, Hotel Bellevue and Hotel Plitvice.

About 300 m from the largest lake, Kozjak, Hotel Jezero is situated in the very heart of the Plitvice Lakes National Park. It features restaurants and spa and wellness centre, free Wi-Fi, a flat-screen TV and a private bathroom and private parking.

The 51-room Plitvice hotel is situated next to the entrance to the national park. It features a bar, restaurant, free parking and non-smoking rooms. Situated next to hotel Plitvice is the Bellevue hotel which also offers free Wi-Fi.

Nestled amidst the natural surroundings, these hotels enhance the experience at the park. There are other luxury and budget hotels around the park to accommodate visitors to the park.





The airports nearest to the Plitvice Lakes National Park are Zadar, Zagreb and Rijeka. Visitors can get there from the nearby train stations - Josipdol and Plaški. The park is just 130 km or 2 hrs drive from the Zagreb Airport.

SPEND SOME DAYS IN OFFBEAT PLACES OF NETHERLANDS

High tourist tax? | Surge in hotel prices? | Over-tourism concern?

Look beyond Amsterdam. Dutch tourist board has already stopped promoting Amsterdam because of the over-tourism concern. Most of the cities in Netherlands are overcrowded with tourists coming from different parts of the world. Netherland's tourist numbers are anticipated to grow from 19 million now to 29 million over the next decade- this is alarming. Amsterdam's city centre is crowded with tourists. The tourists' hotspots like Dam Square, Warmoesstraat and Zeedijk are full-packed from morning until late at night, making it extremely difficult for the locals to carry out their daily business. The management is now chalking out plans to save the destinations from over crowdedness. Dutch tourist board also hopes to spread tourists out to less visited parts of the Netherlands. The places like the medieval city of Harleem, rural fishing town of Volendam, Utrecht, Pampus Island, Scheveningen, De Veluwe, Nijmegen and many others are being promoted to divert the tourists. The city has raised its tourist tax in 2018 in a bid to control numbers and arrange for the costs and externalities that the huge volume creates. So, it's better to explore the other side of the Netherlands.

Medieval City of Harleem : Harleem is a very small city with abundant cultural insights. Haarlem has its medieval centre, where you can see origin of the Netherland and its political history. Stay here and shop at Grote Market. It is just 10 minutes' walk from the city centre. Visit Molen De Adriaan, a windmill area that was built in 18th century. You can visit the windmill and Corrie ten Boom House, which is now a museum. During World War II, the house of the Ten Boom family became the hiding place for Jewish people and people in the Dutch underground. The family saved 800 Jews and refugees. This house including its original furnishings and the secret room can be visited on a single tour.

Zandvoort: North Holland's most pristine beach area is Zandvoort. This quaint place has been an attractive seaside resort since 1828. You can see plenty of welcoming and cultural activities and it is a favourite among sun lovers and families. It has two beautiful nature parks with rich flora and fauna. Just 30 minutes drive from Amsterdam, Zandvoort has low budget accommodations, apt for your romantic hideaway.



Volendam :Holland's fishing town, Volendam is beautiful for its harbour life. A visit to Volendam begins with a short walk down De Dijk, the main harbour strip, which remains a lively shopping and residential street. See the working trawlers and fishing boats, which remain the lifeblood for many. Also see the traditional wooden buildings and homes. Spend most of your lazy time in this fishing village by sampling the freshly caught seafood. Taste local foods at a variety of cosy cafés and restaurants, along with outdoor seafood vendors, which will surely lure your tastebuds.

Utrecht : Just 20 minutes' train ride from Amsterdam, Utrecht is centered on a gigantic gothic steeple, Dom Tower. Utrecht has relaxed ambience. Explore the hidden gems of the city by walking through its mysterious alleyways and see the beautiful courts reminding Dutch stories of bygone days.

Pampus Island : Just 15 minutes' bus journey from Amstel station, this island was once used as a fort to save the city from foreign invaders. Now, this island waits for the tourists to see the flying birds resting on the turrets. It is an ideal weekend gateway from busy Amsterdam.

Scheveningen: Want to enjoy idle summer? Visit Scheveningen. Stay here for some days in the midst of sandy beach life. Here surfing is one of the key sports. The beach of Scheveningen features the best surfing facilities imaginable.



NOTRE-DAME CATHEDRAL

EUROPE'S FINEST MEDIEVAL ERA MARVEL

Notre-dame in French means '*Our Lady*', the seat of archbishop of Paris is a jewel of medieval Gothic architecture. In 1163, the construction of the cathedral started on a small island , Ile de la Cite in the middle of Seine during the reign of King Louis VII. It was completed in 1345. The walls and interior vaulted ceilings were made up of stone while the roof and spire were of wood, sheathed in lead to exclude water.

Flying buttresses were inserted to support the structure and add to the cathedral's Gothic style. During the French Revolution in the 1790s, it was damaged and neglected. After significant spur by Victor Hugo's 1831 novel there were overhauls between the period 1844 to 1864, leading the architects Jean-Baptiste-Antoine Lassus and Eugène-Emmanuel Viollet-le-Duc to redo the spire and flying buttresses.

As per France's law, the government owns the cathedral and Catholic archdiocese of Paris uses it permanently for free. According to the priests, the government should pay for repairs as it owned the building; however the government's agreement specifies that the archdiocese is responsible for its maintenance. According to a leading media the cathedral was in dire need of a makeover and the renovation was expected to cost somewhere around \$180 million. The cathedral was previously burnt in the 13th century that prompted additional work between 1230 and 1240.

A fundraising campaign was launched by the President Emmanuel Macron which as on April 22, 2019 brought in pledge more than €1 billion. The Ministry of Culture in 2014 estimated that it required a renovation of €150 million and the Archdiocese of Paris in 2016 launched an appeal to raise €100 million over the following five to ten years.

Remarkable events: In 1431 Henry VI of England was made king of France inside Notre-Dame and in 1804, Napoleon Bonaparte, who also sought to save the storied cathedral, was crowned emperor. In 1909, Joan of Arc, who had helped France battle the English and was burned at the stake centuries earlier, was beatified in the cathedral by Pope Pius X. In the recent collapse of the spire that took place last month had the relics –the teeth, bones or hair-of the patron saints of Paris, St. Denis and St. Geneviève. These were placed to protect the cathedral by the archbishop.



Endangered heritage sites in Europe

Historic Centre of Vienna, Austria-

The musical capital of Europe since the 16th century houses the likes of Mozart, Beethoven and Schubery. The capital of the Austro-Hungarian Empire is perched on the Danube River and is known for its Baroque castles and gardens. Due to the high-rise constructions in the Austrian capital in 2017 the city was inscribed World Heritage in Danger.



Maritime Mercantile City of Liverpool, United Kingdom - The historic center and docklands of Liverpool was one of the world's major trading centers during the 18th and 19th centuries. It is a pioneer in the modern dock technology and was instrumental in playing a significant role in facilitating the trans-Atlantic slave trade. Because of the proposed redevelopment scheme in 2012, the site was listed in danger as it would have altered the skyline and isolated the dock areas.



Medieval Monuments in Kosovo - Developed between the 13th and 17th centuries Four Serbian Orthodox Monasteries—Dečani monastery, Patriarchal Monastery of Peć, Our Lady of Ljeviš, and Gračanica monastery—represent the melding of Byzantine and Western medieval traditions. The Medieval Monuments in Kosovo were listed in danger in the year 2006 because of difficulties in its management and conservation arising due to political instability.

The Buzludzha Monument, Bulgaria- Built by the then ruling Bulgarian Communist party is a fine reflection of 20th-century architecture. The monument was abandoned after the end of the communist regime and had been victim to thefts, vandalism and severe weather conditions. The Buzludzha Project Foundation proposed that the monument needed due preservation.



Grimsby Ice Factory, United Kingdom- It was the largest fishing port in the world at the start of the 20th century, since its closure in 1990 it has been in a state of decline, the roof is damaged and there are threats of demolition .Also the area, the Kasbah in which it is located is of national and international significance which is a compact area of the 19th and 20th century, has many fish-processing and fish-related historic buildings. In 2016, there was controversial demolition of a street, there was a public outcry in 2017 the remaining streets of the Kasbah was designated as a Conservation Area.

Meadows in the Mountains


